PATIENT PREPARATION FOR APPOINTMENT

Ultrasound Abdomen

Nothing to eat, drink, smoke and no chewing gum for 6hrs before test. Under 6yrs old, no prep required.

Ultrasound - Kidneys, Bladder and Pelvis.

Empty bladder and then drink 1 litre (7glasses) of water 1 hr before the scan. Do not go to the toilet. A full bladder is required for this study. Children under 6yrs old, drink 2 glasses 30 minutes before ultrasound.

MRI Cervical Spine	Cervical radiculopathy. Symptoms: neck pain, numbness, weakness, tingling in fingers or hands, herniated disc, nerve damage, nerve impingement, bony spurs, headaches.
MRI Cervical Spine	Cervical spine trauma, any kind of neck injury.
MRI Knee	Inability to extend the knee suggesting the possibility of acute meniscal tear. Clinical findings suggesting acute anterior cruciate ligament tear.



MRI Spine	Following radiographic examination of any of the following: Assessment of significant trauma. Unexplained neck or back pain with significant neurological signs. Unexplained back pain with significant pathology suspected.
MRI Elbow	Following radiographic examination where a significant fracture or avulsion injury is suspected that will change management.
MRI Wrist	Following radiographic examination where scaphoid fracture is suspected.
MRI Hip	Following radiographic examination for any of the following: Investigation of suspected septic arthritis. Investigation of slipped capital femoral epiphysis. Suspected Perthes Disease.
MRI Knee	Following radiographic examination for internal joint derangement.
